Saturday Mar 22  
 begins with a strong breeze ship  
 steering different courses to the northward and  
 westward under top sails and fore sail  
 until regaining the L. B. at 3.00 P.M. left to  
 the wind on the western tack  
 middle part ship under short sail heading the same  
 at 10.00 P.M. wore ship and stood on the  
 eastern tack  
 latter part ship under easy sail heads the same

Lat 14=22 S  
 Long = 52 W

Sunday Mar 23  
 begins the same ship heads the same  
 at 4.00 P.M. wore ship and put the L. B. out  
 by reefed forward and stood along on the western  
 tack  
 middle part ship under short sail heading the same  
 at 3.00 P.M. wore ship and stood to the eastward  
 latter part blessed breeze ship under all sail heading  
 the same at 7.00 P.M. tacked ship and stood to the  
 westward

Lat 14=40 S  
 Long = 06 W

Monday Mar 24  
 begins with a pleasant breeze ship  
 by the wind on the western tack under all sail  
 middle part ship under short sail heading the same  
 at 1.00 P.M. wore ship and stood to the eastward  
 latter part strong breeze ship under easy sail  
 on the eastern tack perpendicular regaining the  
 L. B. at 12.00 M. tacked ship and stood to the  
 westward

Lat 14=54 S  
 Long = 14 W

Tuesday Mar 25  
 begins with a strong breeze ship  
 by the wind on the western tack under easy sail  
 broke out water at 7.00 P.M. wore ship  
 middle part ship under short sail heading the same  
 latter part strong breeze and squally ship  
 on the eastern tack under double reefed fore  
 topsail

Lat 14=48 S  
 Long = 19 W

Wednesday Mar 26  
 begins with a strong breeze ship by the  
 wind on the eastern tack under the same sail  
 at 3.00 P.M. raised a sail off our weather bow  
 at 5.00 P.M. spoke and gained B. to President A. M.  
 of Cape Bedford 18 miles from here with 120 fms. storm  
 middle part ship under short sail heading the same  
 latter part ship under easy sail squally with rain  
 at 8.00 P.M. tacked ship and stood to the westward  
 at 12.00 M. tacked again and stood to the eastward

Lat 14=06 S  
 Long = 48 W

Thursday Mar 27  
 begins the same thick rainy weather  
 at 4.00 P.M. tacked ship and stood on the western tack  
 middle part ship heading the same under top sails  
 and courses  
 latter part at 6.00 P.M. wore ship and stood on  
 the eastern tack weather very thick and raining  
 broke out bread and beef

Lat 14=10 S  
 Long = 58 W

Friday Mar 28  
 begins the same at 1.00 P.M. wore  
 ship and stood to the westward  
 middle part ship under short sail heading the same  
 at 7.00 P.M. wore ship and stood to the eastward  
 latter part strong breeze ship under double reefed  
 fore topsail on the eastern tack

Lat 14=11 S  
 Long = 00 W

Saturday Mar 29  
 begins the same at 3.00 P.M. tacked  
 ship and stood on the western tack  
 On Friday bent new fore sail and jib  
 middle part ship under short sail heading the same  
 latter part fresh breeze ship under easy sail  
 heading the same at 12.00 M. tacked ship  
 and stood on the eastern tack

Lat 14=48 S  
 Long = 33 W
