Tues 14th

Wed. 15th

The wind is blowing hard from the N.E. these twenty four hours.

Took the Capt ashore at Fayal & brought of a pilot. We came to an anchor in Fayal at 1 O'clock P.M. where we were moored by the harbor master.

Thurs. 16th

The weather these twenty four hours was good. We wrapped down the masts

In the Bk. before the ship California & a sailing ship lay off & on.

Foremast hands William Lawson & Barney Bruce refused duty. Lawson is ringleader & has ever since he has been aboard trying to incite the crew to disobedience of orders.

Fri. 17th

The whole of these twenty four hours the weather was fair, with a light northerly wind.

Crew employed on general (ships) work Joseph D. Leshander refused duty this morning. Capt came aboard to investigate the cause of their refusing duty & took them ashore before the court. Leshander was returned to duty & Lawson & Bruce by order of the Comm were sent to jail

Got a spinning jennie from the Palmetto to make some line yarn

While looking over the head gear we found that the gamon lashing had parted

Sat. 18
