Thur. 24th

Fair with a strong westerley wind

Started up our try works

Fri. 25th

These twenty four hours were fair with a strong westerley wind

Commenced dragging & so let go 2nd anchor

Trying out & stowing down

Sat. 26th

The first part of these 24 hours we had a very strong S.W. wind the latter part was fair with a light wind

Finished trying out & stowing down 63 bbls. & then commenced scraping bone. Our bone got very dirty this time so we had to wash it some before we could stow it below

Sun. 27th

These twenty four hours were fair with a light westerley wind. We finished scraping & cleaning bone

A german Steamer anchored close by through the night & departed again in the morning

Mon. 28th

These twenty four hours were fair with a very light Easterly wind

Crew employed cleaning ship. Capt. & myself went on shore & had a look at the Mining camp at Cape Virgin, & also brought of some sand & use on our clock

March

Tues. 1st

These twenty four hours were fair with a light N.E. wind

We weighed anchor & got under way, & look for another whale. See an English mail steamer bound through the Straits

Wed. 2nd

The weather during these 24 hours was fair, with very light shifting winds

Capt set up a couple casks today

The Argentine Government boat Villavieja passed us going N.

A little before 4 o'clock A.M. a Steamer passed close by us who had probably been at anchor, for we were close in shore
