Sat. 12th

During the whole of these 24 hours we had strong winds from the westward with an hour or a fine weather between puffs

Mon. 14th

The whole of these 24 hours were fair with a strong westerly wind during the first part, the night & latter part the wind very light

The whole of these 24 hours were fair with a light westerly wind

Wed. 16th

The first few hours were fair with light westerly wind at sun down we had a few squalls with rain, the night & latter part fair

The first part of these 24 hours were fair with a light westerly wind during the night it began to blow strong from the south & continued so far the rest of the twenty four hours

During the first part of these twenty four hours the wind moderated & by night we had a light westerly wind in the morning it turned back to the northeast again blowing strong
