

Lying at Ancho at Lehigha Nani

685

Saturday October 25th 1854

Been ashore again today with the Starboard watch  
Went to court the first thing... Puno plead guilty of the charge  
of furiously running a horse through the streets and was fined  
5 dollars the smallest amount for the offence and the other  
plead not guilty and was discharged. There were more against  
them so they could both be cleared as well as not. The fine  
is not less than 5 dollars or over 5.00. A 6 o'clock  
came in. The Benj. Tucker with the crew. Finished  
two letters on shore and sent them in a great hurry under  
the lantern after she had got a bit and a buff at sea  
pulled aboard in the evening without my supper and they  
are now on their way to our loved ones

Not hold Sunday October 29th

The Starboard watch in Liberty and I had liberty to go to  
meeting and join in the delightful exercise of praise  
The text may be found in the 2<sup>d</sup> chapter of Ephesians & verse  
At 4 had a meeting on board the ship Brasilia of Mr. B  
Capt. B. had a first rate meeting and think the effort  
will not be lost. I hope we shall not be behind in the service

Monday October 30th

The first thing in the morning took the boat on deck and  
loaded a boat with it with a view of taking it to the ship  
Warren of Tisbury but had to unload again as she was  
not ready for it. Floated Mr. Lake's oil on deck expecting  
to land that on shore but found ourselves mistaken in  
that also. The Starboard watch on shore, I stayed on board

Tuesday October 31st

The ship has been made to receive with praise to God  
One of our men before the mast has been deeply com-  
mitted within a short time and has prayed twice in  
the fore-castle and tonight I joined with him in singing  
and praying reading and exhorting and am pleased  
to say we had the entire attention of all and  
think with the help of God there will be some good  
done in his name. There is a great interest on the part of the crew  
and surely we should be instruments in his hand

Delivered 19 1/2 gals of whale oil to Mr. Lake as pay for  
his season's work

Wednesday  
Friday November 1st 1854

The two men very strong. The Martha dragged down along side of  
us and as she had no crew the Captain of her got a few more folks  
to help haul her off. The Falcon lost her fly jib boom after  
taring another ship's spunk with it. Got off a raft of 8 casks  
of water without paying the customary charge of 16 dollars by  
taking them with the Bigland's raft. Shipped our bone 166  
bunches 12 7/8 lbs on board of the ship Warren of Tisbury  
The Starboard watch on Liberty. I happened to be amongst them  
Had our little prayer meeting in the fore-castle

Thursday November 2nd

The Starboard watch on shore and the Starboard watch have  
done nothing but point the ladder. Mr. Bishop asked  
the Captain if he could preach <sup>on board</sup> for us next Sunday afternoon  
but was told the deck was so cluttered with bone that there  
was no room. What a story! The bone was all sent off  
yesterday. Had a beautiful meeting in the fore-castle this  
evening. One ship sailed and one came in

Friday November 3rd

Demons have been the burning exercises. On the first place  
The Gosson came on board nearly drunk and got in to a game  
with Pierce and they had a drink. Mr. Oakman separated  
them when he was dizzy and was ordered to leave the game  
which he refused to do and as he continued to maintain  
his place obstinately. Mr. Oakman struck him <sup>down</sup> and  
he got up and started for C. when he gave him a push and  
he stumbled and fell down the back hatch. I caught  
in time to save him from reaching the deck. That  
settled it. We then had our meeting in the fore-castle  
The Starboard watch on Liberty. The Captain heard of  
our meetings and fairly concluded to have a meeting here  
next Sunday and sent me to invite Mr. Bishop

Saturday November 4th

Six or 8 more ships have arrived since yesterday morning  
and 3 or 4 have left to seek their fortune  
The ship continues to say she would rather prospect is gone for  
10 days longer. The Starboard watch on Liberty  
shall have our evening meeting as usual and tomorrow  
shall have one in the afternoon
