

1056 Sunday November 4th 1855
about 8 in. of snow had been within the sound of the gale
today. Mr. Bishop preached to us from an excellent text
which will be found in the *Pratt* Nov. 4th "Why should
you here all the day idle". The Capt. came off for
the first time and gave all that wished to go to church to
get ready something a little expected but rejoiced at the
chance. Returned at dinner. Yesterday there was an
arrangement made for Mr. Whadgate to go to Honolulu
for our letters but the schooner before her time and he
got left. We shall probably go with the ship in a few days.

1057 Monday November 5th
at 2 o'clock
Last night a boat went to a little place called Myerka
about 20 miles for potatoes and food, and have just returned
about in the evening without either. I believe
I have now learned that Daniels the man who was to fur-
nish the articles had just gone to Lahaina. There just arrived
two 20 lbs of Irish potatoes from the schooner *Wharwick*
Could not get the flour from the shore as we could not get
any things from the shore. I have 20 lbs of flour. Got 5
lbs of rice and 20 or 30 white potatoes.

1058 Tuesday November 6th
The 4 small boats were called and two boats were
called for our provisions which we brought
in a dory at two loads consisting of 25 lbs of
meat & 2 casks of flour (or 20 lbs) 2 pipes of sails and
can of paint oil, four cags of tobacco, 3 coils of
cordage and the Capt. Secretary which was
badly mangled and shrank. that the *Wharwick* brought
it to piece the *Wharwick* in our first of whale
carried 27 empty bbls to *Boles* for which he paid
about 100. do. I believe.

1059 Wednesday November 7th
This is right. We left at last by daylight. The *Wharwick* has
run the poor fellow too had lately. Took off 8 lbs of sugar
potatoes for the *Wharwick* in the *Wharwick* and other little things
with a part of a boat load of wood and shall have our own
boat tomorrow by the name of *Wharwick* whom shall be
ready for sea. I suppose the *Wharwick* will go showing
right in to go back of the *Wharwick* I like him and crew too.

Round for Honolulu

1060 Thursday November 8th 1855
We have expected to get away to day but have been disap-
pointed. Mr. *Wharwick* came on board today and was
introduced by Mr. *Wharwick* as first officer and we
were to stay him as such. Then Mr. *Wharwick* prom-
ised to take us as well as we could. This is all fair
but I fear he may forget it. He had everything in hand
and all in a hurry to leave but the Capt. had not
finished his wonderful business.

1061 Friday November 9th
We were now going to Honolulu. The Capt.
came off just before dark bringing three passengers
Capt. *Wharwick* of the ill-fated ship *Wharwick* and his
isbleaching in the Southern Ocean; one is a doctor and the
other is a young fellow I do not know. One came in the
morning and was a partner of the *Wharwick*.
The doctor found a *Wharwick* they have claimed up
the *Wharwick* to place in a *Wharwick* and the *Wharwick* has
taken care of itself by blowing away or getting badly
split. I have not been up to see how bad
During the afternoon two of our Kanakas came and
brought five their clothes. They had to apply to a
