January 1893. On board ship Sea of Warren

The latter part of this month while running through
 King's mill group I saw need of measures
 than I ever saw before this cluster of islands
 lies in the longitude of 178 to 179 East

 with the exception of Ocean Island they are but
 little above the level of the sea ships when making
 the land see the coconut trees first on
 the canoes sailing at long shore some of the is-
 lands has no water at all and them that has it

 it. ... there mostly food is coconut and fish
 the coconut tree is both food and drink and its
 wood makes them canoes and from the sap they
 make molasses. But the white man has
 been at many times and he has learned them
