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Sunday November 27 1843. On board Ship Lee
Lying at anchor at Lahine first part of this day went
on shore saw several old acquaintances at 5 o'clock
Went to the Councils office and reshired Second officers for
the 39 lay at 4 came on board at 5 o'clock P.M.
Called all hands to make preparations to slip the cable
blowing strong from S.W. with ruin
at more moderate

Monday 23 commenced with fresh trails and pleasant weather. Latter part received some bread and other things from ship Columbus.

Tuesday 29 first part fine weather received from
bread from Schooner Maria and delivered some
bread on board bark fortune latter part fine weather
Employed at various things trip one of our boatmen
was discharged and William Perry

Wednesday 30th first part of this day beautiful weather the authorities took Mr. Muehlinney out of the ship to bring him to trial for his cruel Captain Lowell very sick with the dysentery. Later looked the sails to dry Mr. Muehlinney received an honorable discharge.

Thursday ~~at~~ first employed at felling the sails
Unbent the drives to repair and repaired the cutting
blocks and received 25 barrels of potatoes
