

On Board Ship Sea of Warren R: I
 Sailing to anchor at Tahiti

Monday February 13 1854

First part of this day calm and very warm we are waiting for a breeze to take us to sea Mr. Carroll first officer of ship came in to day trying to find some men they had lost but without success. Latter part calm got off some sand employed at repairing a gibbe so ends

Tuesday 14 commenced calm had a light shower of rain employed at repairing gibbe put one of the old boats on the board. The captain was angry because one of the boats were lowered to go on shore forbade the mates lowering them simply in case of fire the weather very warm the barometer stands at 30 in the cabin Middle and latter part the same

Wednesday 15 commenced calm at 4 o'clock the Abalaca of London went out with the assistance of the other ships boats. Captain gave the mate a long lecture for carelessness. The captain had loaned a small pump to the old bark of Antinet and when we got it out from between decks we found the hose spoiled. Middle part had some wind and rain at 11 o'clock the captain came on board and said he had some trouble about a fishhook he had made on shore they charged him 12 dollars for bending a bar of iron when he could purchase it there one for 4 dollars. First part of the day brought off 4 natives that ran away and were put on the port the cabin boy went on shore last evening and did not return. Latter part the Emerald of Bay Harbour went out by the time the pilot came to us the wind had left so we could not get employed at repairing fore top sail.

Thursday 16 first part light variable winds. Employed at repairing fore top sail had heard from the cabin boy but could not find him. Middle part heard the cabin boy was on board the Brig Lucy aboard and was put on board of her by a boat of the veterans the Police went
