

Steamer Alaska Capt. Gray

About 8 o'clock they lowered a Boat and came on-board brought some papers. We had a light swell of wind and rain this afternoon. There is some little swell on this evening that makes some of the Passengers with themselves on shore the day ends with fine weather.

Sunday September 13th 1868

The day begins with fine weather our latitude is 25. Longitude is or made 250 miles the last 24 hours. We had preaching this afternoon & evening in the Saloon the day has passed quite pleasantly and ends with fine weather and light breeze from the N.E. Sea on this day.

Monday September 14th 1868

The day begins fine raised land this morning about eight o'clock on our starboard beam low. I do not know the name see Castle Island on our Port beam this afternoon the weather looks rather rough light squalls of rain raised land again about four o'clock it is the Island of Cuba it is on our starboard beam at eight o'clock the weather looks squally this evening with light breeze from the N.E. Sea.

Tuesday September 15th 1868

This day begins with fine weather passed the Island of Jamaica and Port-au-Prince de Day spoke the Steamer Arizona this morning from Aspinwall she took passed a bark flying the French colors Day ends fine.

Wednesday September 16th 1868

This day begins with fine weather we are expected to get in to Aspinwall tomorrow so they have been weighing baggage to day not for the far all over us this afternoon there is a light breeze from the N.E. & very hot so ends this day very warm.

Thursday September 17th 1868

This Day begins fine and very warm raised land this morning about 10 o'clock got alongside the wharf about 2 o'clock left Aspinwall for Panama about 4 o'clock arrived at eight and went on board the Colorado arrived at 9 o'clock at night Room 47

Friday September 18th 1868

The day begins fine & very hot Thermometer stands at 82 deg in the shade we are on board the Colorado this morning the day at an anchor in the bay I have been ashore this afternoon came here being caught in a thunder shower the Thermometer stands at this afternoon at six o'clock we are still at anchor this is a Whaler ship just came to an anchor off here I do not know her name the day ends very hot & sultry.

Saturday September 19th 1868

The day begins fine with a light breeze from S.W. weighed anchor last night at 12 o'clock passed out of Panama Bay this morning at daylight passed the Steamer Golden City about 10 o'clock to day received our table tickets to day Breakfast at 9 o'clock Dinner at 12 & Supper at 5 saw a Hump Back Whale & several porpoise to day the day ends fine land on our St. Beam.

Sunday September 20th 1868

We are still in sight of land this morning this afternoon is quite squally with thunder and rain there has been a wedding in the Saloon to day and again this evening the weather has cleared up this evening and the day ends fine with light breeze from the N.E. Sea.

Monday September 21st 1868

Fine weather this morning & light breeze from the N.E. one of the children belonging to a Storage passage died this morning and was buried at 12 o'clock to day the weather continues fine until evening it begins to look squally think we will have some rain to night another child died this afternoon in the second Cabin to be buried to night at sunset.

Tuesday September 22nd 1868

The day begins very hot & close very little wind the Puff and have been drilling the fire alarm bell I have made the acquaintance of Mr. Allen the Second Officer of the Colorado he belongs in St. Helena St. there is land in sight on our St. Beam also the volcano Diablo burning on our quarter it looks very much like a storm this evening think we will have some rain the day ends very hot Thermometer stands at 91
