

Bark Sea Breeze bound from Honolulu to New Bedford R.D. Wick Master

February 1871

Sunday 12th

Came in with light wind from North and good weather & continues so through the day

Monday 13th

So day has been nearly calm day sent down the main top Gall Sail for repairs and other small jobs

Tuesday 14th

Came in with light wind from N.E. with squalls of rain middle part clear away calm latter part breeze up from North

Wednesday 15th

Came in with strong breeze from N.W. with rain and heavy squalls from N.E. continues so nearly all day

Thursday 16th

Commenes with dead calm clear weather & quite hot middle part have light eads from N.W. latter part a light wind comes up from N.E. ship steering by the wind to the westward

Friday 17th

Came in with light breeze from N.W. middle part a dead calm latter part light breeze from S.W. continues so until 8 P.M. & die away calm again

February 1871

Saturday 18th

Came in with light wind from North with rain middle part pouring rain latter part clear up and wind freshens ship heading E. by S.

Lat 28-30 South
Long 28-20 West

Sunday 19th

Came in with fine clear weather and light breeze from North & continues so through the day

Lat 27-24
Long 26-29

Monday 20th

Commences with strong breeze from the North ship heading E. by S. 2 P.M. Tacked ship & stood to the westward the latter part wind freshens but continues clear through the day

Lat 25-29

Long 24-23

Tuesday 21st

Came in with strong breeze from the North and clear weather ship on the eastern tack through the day

Wednesday 22nd

Came in with light wind from North & clear middle part wind hauls to N.E. and continues so latter part light squalls of rain

Lat 24-12 South
Long 22-37

Thursday 23rd

Came in with fresh breeze from N.E. and squalls middle part clear breeze freshens latter part wind moderates again one sail in sight
