Monday May 11th

Lat 32-58 N
Long 65-05 W

This day comes in with fresh breezes from E. S. E. of Bk heading E. the wind S. by W middle & latter part strong breezes and thick & hazy from S. S. E. whole that sail on opposite tack

Tuesday May 12th

This day comes in with light pleasant weather from S. S. W at 6:30 am raised the B. Beruapada ship off steering E. S. E. at 10 am took a Pilot and at 12 P. M. took a Tug Boat and came to anchor at 3:30 P. M. at the Port of St. George Beruapada at 11 P. M. in the 3rd water watch on deck 4 men jumped over board and started to swim a short lired the S. Boat and got one of them think 2 got on shore and one supposes to have been drowned so ends this day

Wednesday May 13th

This day had fine light weather from the Westward employed fitting the old 4th Stays and getting ready for New of Fire Topmast Riggging so ends this day

Thursday May 14th Lat 32-58 N
Long 65-05 W

Light pleasant weather from N. W sent up the F. T. mast Riggging and set it up and commenced felling down sold a few Boat off the Deck fitted put a stayer on M. F. Gallant Riggging where the Riggging had strayed so ends this day

Friday May 15th

Light pleasant weather from the Eastward finished Rattling down Top mast Riggging broke out a Chest of Tea

Saturday May 16th

Fresh breezes from S. S. E. took a Tug Boat and at 10 am went to sea Tug leaving at 11:30 am steering S. by E. so ends the day sent the Steward Forward my good

Sunday May 17th

Too part of this day squally from S. W steering E. by N middle & latter part light air & Calms steering E. saw one sail

sent one letter to wife
