Br 295 181 This day comes in with strong breeze from South. got off 2 dead loads of ice. Suffered the day with a strong breeze from S.W.

182 This day comes in with a fresh hail from S.W. at 6 a.m. the ice broke up ship going into the rocks on March 1st got out 2 lines with ice packs. I should be back from the rocks as much as possible at 2 P.M. blowing a heavy storm from S.E. got a set 2 more lines on there in case of the wind shifting to the N.W. Ice and side of ship all broke into small pieces the only ice left of any size was up in the kyle of the harbor. ship lying broad side to the wind. creeping down gradually the shore rocks and ahead of ship on March 1st side rocks kept out 60 feet at 4 P.M. ahead of ship ice still breaking the ice also at 10 a.m. ice found the buidder and broke of the filler next to the buidder head. Ice 9 fathoms thick so ends the day lying jammed in the ice.
