Days from 339
 To 340
 Friday April 1st To 32 B7
 This day light air from the westward and pleasant cold winds employed the Banking all around the ship from the fore to the stern this day

340 Saturday April 2nd To 31 B7
 Light breeze from SE and pleasant at 7:30 AM the ship came up out of the ice leaving the Rudder in the ice went to work cutting out the Rudder and took it in the morning finished at 5 PM all 3 Rudders painted per broken off from her sounding last Nov in the Rocks in the Passage coming into the inner Harbor so ends this day

341 Sunday April 3rd To 30 B7
 This day light westerly winds & cloudy got a load of ice and commenced to work on the Rudder got the Rudder's shape all so ends this day 2nd Officer employed with the Cooper filling the Rudder

 342 Monday April 4 To 29 B7
 This day light breeze from the North all hands except Cooper and my self to work cutting the Rudder out from the outer Harbor cutting Rudders so ends

Dr 29 7/10
 343 Tuesday April 5th To 28 B7
 This day comes in with an moderate breeze from the Eastward with snow employed cutting Rudders and to work on Rudder at 2 PM all came on board blowing away from the latter part blowing a Gale from North so ends

 344 Wednesday April 6th To 27 B7
 The part of this day blowing a fair fresh SE wind employed a work on Rudder and latter part more moderate from SE so ends
