Days from Home
 373 Thursday May 5th T 32 B 2
 Fresh breeze from the westward
 and quite cold latter part calm

374 Friday May 6th T 20-30 B 2
 Light easterly winds got
 one load of ice so ends

375 Saturday May 7th T 20-30 B 2
 Fresh breeze from the north
 and quite cold so ends

376 Sunday May 8th T 20-25 B 2
 This day blowing a moderate
 gail from the north
 started for the eastward
 but returned back on the
 coast of ice and wind was cloudy
 with some light snow so ends

377 Monday May 9th T 20-30 B 2
 Fine part of this day stormy
 the wind rather fresh blowing
 a gail from the north so ends

378 Tuesday May 10th T 20-28 B 2
 This day blowing a gail from
 the north emptied the last 2 coal casks
 so ends

379 Wednesday May 11th T 18-24 B 2
 Strong breeze from the NW got
 one load of ice weather pleasant so
 ends

380 Thursday May 12 T 0-24 B 2
 This day light pleasant weather
 from the NW the natives went to
 the main land in a whale boat hunting
 employed stowing off the deck stowed
 down 122 lbs of salt water in
 main hold and finished stowing
 off the deck so ends the day

381 Friday May 13th T 5-11 B 2
 Light fine weather from the
 NW employed rolling ice to
 the ship 24 casks so ends

382 Saturday May 14th T 5-10 B 2
 Light southerly winds the
 main pack of ice from dead
 was not off last night
 employed getting the ice marks
 right for melting ice got 2
 loads of ice 27 casks so ends foggy
