Monday May 23rd T 10 24.82

391 This day fresh breeze from S.E. to S.W. did not sail ice on account of the drift ice being in cut the Tranches astern of the ship to the gut 270 feet and got the sleds and every thing off of dead mares & down drift to the channel and the ice so much cloudy

Tuesday May 24th T 15 25.02

392 This day blowing a fresh gale from S. to S.W. & cloudy and pack of ice still in the flane at 7 P.M. the ship started back out of her bay got out one back out each had with a runner and hove her up to her head again so ends wind blowing strong and still falling to the S.W.

Wednesday May 25th T 20-30.2

393 Light pleasant weather from S.W. to S.W. got one load of ice at 3 P.M. the ice went off from the flane went down and showed out the big peaks that lay in the channel so ends the ice all out up to the over crake

Thursday May 26th S 25 032

394 This day light pleasant weather from N.W. to S.W. sent up 5 M. Top Gallant yards at 12 M. went down on the flane to work got off 3 ft. Peaks ice on marble ice ship came off and put up the channel so ends opened the steam house and sky light

395 Light breeze from S to S.W. with some snow went down to the flane but could do nothing ice came in at 3 P.M. ice as far as the eye could reach so ends
