This day light breeze from
S.W. & pleasant employed
sailing. Ice got out 12th of
ice. Peas came on board 1st
dinner and went to sleep all
hands at 7 P.M. went to the
field and got out the
remainder of the peas & seeds

405 This day comes in with
breeze from S.W. 2 last of
ice. Peas gained had to cut them
up into small pieces got the
cannell through and the peas
ice came down from main
ice side up to the main ice
returned on board at 2.30 of
at 8 P.M. commenced to sail to the
ship from the gut in river harbor
finished at 2 P.M. weather cloudy
with light breeze from S.W.
after part of day. Boatmen
standing watch. Ice not gone
from outer harbor

with a strong breeze from S.W.

Light breeze from S.W. 3 natives
Savannah natives came on board at
1 P.M. at 9 A.M. I took our Boat
and 5 natives and went to the main
land and got 25 musk. Co. Skins
returned on board at 6 P.M. weather
pleasant so ends get the children
off the Boat and Peas up so ends

Thursday June 9th

Fore part of this day fresh breeze
from the Westward. Middle &
after part blowing a Gail
from S.W. the Peas of ice
gone. The natives went back to
the main in by back. 4 of them
took the ice out in the outer
harbor. Packed one case of musk. skins 20
and shipped it away
