Sunday July 10th

439

m

29 $\frac{7}{10}$

This day light breeze from NW working through scattering ice to the edge a Boat crew of 8 natives came off on board from sheet at Mont Jones left at 11 am latter part lying ground in open water from huge floes S.W.

Monday July 11th

29 $\frac{5}{10}$

This day strong breeze from S.W. at 11 am the ice sheet in the ship picked all sails and made fast to the ice the ice packed solid from NW. D. S. Mont Jones hearing about west 25 miles so ends at 10 am saw a whale calf spit 3 times going quick & dark.

Tuesday July 12th

29 $\frac{4}{10}$

Fore part of this day strong breeze from SE with thick fog let up some at 7 am let go from the ice and work out into scattering ice to the westward happy with some gaily & ends with strong breeze lying aback.

Wednesday July 13th

442

29 $\frac{5}{10}$

Fore part blowing a gail from NW on sheet table 12 minutes each in a very narrow strip of water latter part more moderate but Jones hearing N.E. or S.W.

Thursday July 14th

29 $\frac{7}{10}$

This day light air from NW working (the ship) through the ice into the N.E. Mont Jones hearing NW at 6 am 25 miles so ends.

Friday July 15th

444

29 $\frac{7}{10}$

Fore part of this day light air & clouds from SE working through the ice middle part took a light breeze from S.W. working to the north at 4 am Mont Jones hearing SW 30 miles so ends.

Saturday July 16th

445

29 $\frac{6}{10}$

Fore part ship in the ice with light S.W. breeze at 4 am made sail with light breeze from South working to the eastward through scattering ice at 7 am came to the spot left to in scattering ice thick fog came in for and haul and off let up again so ends lying on apperit latter in scattering ice fresh breeze from North latter part light breeze with fog.
