Monday Sep 12th

This day comes in with a cold from the north with light & snow. Bk heading in shore at 3 a.m. more moderate started the rigging at 6 a.m. also sighted the land Cape Cod at 5 miles. At 8 a.m. all hands employed Bailing and mauling sail (staring) for the spits. At 6 p.m. Bk heading by the wind by compass 4 p.m. for land in sight at 6 p.m. Coaled down the works. Latter part flying ahead in 23. Partisans of lighter wind very light winds.

Tuesday Sep 13th

started Bailing 4 a.m.

This day comes in with light breezes from south and cloudy. Bk under all sail by the wind heading 5 p.m. to 4 p.m. maul the sails at 10 a.m. and at 5 p.m. Tacked ship off shore land about 5 miles off. Could not weather the Cape south Hampton finished Bailing at 4 p.m. Latter part under 1 top sail strong breezes from S & small squalls & clouds.

This day comes in with strong breezes and heavy snow squalls. Bk under all sail at 9 a.m. started off 8 p.m. to show the oil finished stowing at 7 p.m. Stowed 17 p.m. Latter part light air under short sail heading to the S.E.

Thursday Sep 15th

Fore part of this day light breezes and clouds. Bk under all sail at 8 a.m. were ship heading to the S.E. at 5 p.m. heading 4 p.m. sighted the South head light of Cape South Hampton. Latter part light breeze under short sail heading to the S.E.

Friday Sep 16th

Fresh breezes from the southward and cloudy. Bk heading to the Eastward sighted the North shore of Cape Cod at 10 a.m. and at 10 a.m. started into the S.E. at 1 p.m. Bk quite packed from Cape Cod into the North at 4 p.m. Cape Cod broke bearing S.W. 5 miles. Latter part flying off 4 a.m. in clear water.
