course S. at 5 P.M. toward all 21 boats
Exp. the crew at sunset calm.
M. & L. Part. Light winds & Pleasant from SE
at 12 M. wind on saw Black Fish toward 4
boats & got 2 small ones. Then B. Boat & Mast
came on board at 4 P.M. came on board.

Indica of the Red Head 27. month 300 from 330 W
Lat 36. 30. Long --- M. & L. part Light breeze & cloudy

Saturday 24th
fresh breeze & fine weather Steering E by N. E. S. L. repaid
the main sail with a fin back Lat 36. 11. Long 22. 27 W
middle & latter part the same for a black hump, E.

Sunday 25th
Fresh breeze from the North West and fine weather
Steering S. E. in the evening gale with the Black
Stephens of New Bedford 2 north 200 from 360 W
Long 21. 20 west Latter part Steering S. E. to S. E. & E. by
fresh breeze from the North West

Monday 26th
Strong breeze and hazy clouds the 26 passed
Lat 36-13 Long 00 15 miles East of the 26. latter part
breeze from the SE in overcast

Tuesday 27th
Fair fresh breeze from the Southwest and clear sky
Lat. Steering N. E. Lat 35-10 Long 28 miles E.
Latter part the same heading N. E.

Wednesday 28th
Beginning with moderate breeze and fine weather at 12 M.
tacka ship to the Southwest at 5 P.M. saw a Right
whale under a 4 masts in chase without success
Sunset shortens Lat Lat 34-00 Long 1-15 East
Latter part Light breeze and fine weather at 5 P.M. saw
whale again. Latter with out success, early fog
