Strong trades and hazy clouds course
westly N, repaired the main to gallant sail & hatched again
after 4 P.M. same as the gallant sails. mics & I patch
the same course west by N. Lat 23.35 Long 175.20

Monday 21st

Strong trades and fine weather course west by N.
mics fast rain squalls. I patch fine weather repairing
sails. I patch Lat 24.30 Long 178.10 west

Tuesday 22nd

Begins with fresh trades and fine weather
course westly N, repairing sails. mics & I patch the
the same repaired the main topsail

Lat 25.10 Long 177.10 West

Wednesday 23rd

Strong trades and fine weather course
west N, repaired the main sail mics & I patch
the same repairing the fore topsail. Lat 26.58

Thursday 24th

Fresh trades and fine weather course westly N
repaired the fore topsail & hatched the mics & I patch the same
repairing sails & a Boat. Lat 28.30

Fresh trades and fine weather course west by N
repairing. a Boat mics & I patch the same aftering N.

Saturday 26th

Moderate breeze and fine weather course
N. w. put out a new boat on the Larkara crane,
mics & I patch light mics and fine weather course N
by west put out a Boat at Lat 32.08 Long 168.30

Sunday 27th

Light mics and fine weather. Killed a
Bullock on board the gallant ship sent down the
haunch, course N by mics & I patch the same

Lat 34.10 Long 16

Monday 28th

Variable mics and fine weather course N by mics
mics & I patch fresh breeze from S.W. and cloudy
repairing Boat. Blue Smithing etc.

Tuesday 29th

Fresh breeze from S.W. with cloudy weather
see from back. Green huffs & plenty of birds
mics & I patch fresh gals from S.W. & thick weather
same as the light sails double reefed the topsails.

Lat 40.08

Wednesday 30th

Heavy gale from S.W. to N.W. at 1 P.M. saw
a tall sail and larger to on the western tow N
blowing lower in squalls at 5 P.M. the fore topsail
stay sail and larger under the fore mast were
blowing a perfect hurricane from the N.W.
mics fast much the same blowing hard in squalls
after 8 P.M. began to moderate but close reefed
main topsail and the storm sails leaving
N to N.W. E.
