Friday 18 July 1862
 First Part fine breeze from the
 East at 2 P.M. looked up the Ship and put
 back the looking for whales
 Little Part the Ship and Spent
 the day walking to the West at 12 noon
 the Ship Chapin came
 Lat 68.14

Saturday 19th
 First Part fine breeze
 from the South the Ship by the 4th of the day
 at 4 P.M. the 2d of the day
 in camp with said ship
 Little Part the Ship by the 4th of the day
 at 4 P.M. light wind 2 Ship in sight
 Lat 67.50
 171.20

Sunday 20th
 First Part light air and calm
 the Ship walking to the South at 4 P.M. came
 Little Part ran to the West 4th of the day
 the 4th of the day
 So on

Monday 21st
 First Part fine breeze from the
 East at 2 P.M. the Ship by the 4th of the day
 at 5 P.M. the 4th of the day
 Little Part the Barge to the East
 with all the Barge came at 7 P.M.
 saw a Barge going to the South
 Lat 68.24
 171.40

Tuesday 22nd
 First Part fine breeze from the
 East the Ship and Spent the day clearing
 the bay smooths the Ship in sight
 Little Part the Ship by the 4th of the day
 light air and calm from the South the
 South the Ship on the Southern side
 plenty of ice in sight
