

Bound to Madglenor Bay 1862

Friday Decr 12
This Day first part fresh Breeze
and fine Weather from W. E. S. E.
head. N. E. Employed in Repairing
a gibe and Spanker Bent the old
Spanker and gave new gibe
halyards at 3 P.M. Turned and Reef
out of the Tapsails latter part
thick and rainy at 8 P.M.
Split the Main Tapsail and
Bent a secant hauled one

Saturday Decr 13
This Day first part fresh Breeze
and thick Weather with rain
from W. S. E. head. N. E. S. E.
at 5 P.M. Double Reef the Tapsails
purlied the Main sail and
Spanker latter part Wind
increased and hauled to W. S.
came E. S. E. at 10 P.M. set the
Tapsails and foresail at 2 P.M.
purlied the fore Tapsail and clew
Reefed the Main purlied the
foresail Lat 33-32 N. Long 154-22 W.

Sunday Decr 14
This Day first part Madglenor Breeze
and cloudy Weather from W. S.
came E. S. E. at 2 P.M. set the Main
sail and Tapsails Employed
in ship's duty latter part Wind
hauled to W. N. W. and Squally
at 4 P.M. set the fore Tapsails
and fore Tapsail Studensail

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Monday Decr 15
This Day first part light Breeze
and squally Weather from W. N. W.
came E. S. E. at 4 P.M. Wind freshened
set the fore Studensail and purlied
the Main sail at 7 P.M. took in
Tapsails and Studensails Reefed
the Tapsails latter part much
the same Lat 33-30 N. Long 154-30 W.

Tuesday Decr 16
This Day first part Blowing a
Madglenor gale with rain squales
from W. N. W. came E. S. E. at 1 P.M.
purlied the Main Tapsails sheet
and purlied the Main Tapsails
running under foresail Double Reefed
fore Tapsail and single Reefed
Main latter part much the same
Employed in ship's duty
Lat 33-32 N. Long 154-47 W.

Wednesday Decr 17
This Day first part fresh Breeze
and squally Weather from W. N. W.
came E. S. E. at 3 P.M. set the Main
Tapsails Employed in ship's duty
latter part Wind moderated at
4 P.M. came E. S. E. at 6 A.M. Turned
and Reef out of the fore
Tapsail set the fore Tapsails
Made two new ring Staps
Employed in sorting new potatoes
Lat 33-40 N. Long 154-06 W.
