With rain squales at 4 P.M.
came to anchor in Kalaia
in 11 fathoms of Water fifty
fathoms chain and on the big
anchor latter part Employed in Wood

This Day Employed in recruiting

rent on shore fifty gallons of
oil for track

Thursday April 18th
This Day first part fresh Trades
at 2 P.M. got under way and
stead to the Westward all hands
Well latter part much the same

Friday April 19th
This Day fresh Trades With rain
squales came N.W. by 3 all sail out
Employed in picking over
potatoes latter part much the
same Lat 21:49 N

Saturday April 20th
This Day first part fresh Trades
came N.W. by 3 squales With
Employed in fitting the boats
for Whaling all sail out
latter part much the same
Lat 21:45 N Long 167:30 W
