ships Duty vantage and smooth
still sick latter part Wind
halled to the S.W. with rain
at 6 A.M. Wind freshened and
halled to the N.W. head at 11 P.M.
took in sail and Double Reefed
the Topsails Lat 38-12 N. Long 168-41 E

Monday May 4
This Day first part Blowing
fresh from the N.W. head at 11 P.M.
at 2 P.M. Wind moderated made
all sail at 10 P.M. Wind halled
to the E. came at 4 P.M. latter part
Wind freshened and halled to the
S.E. at 9 P.M. took in the
light sails vantage and
smooth still sick
