Friday June 10th
This Day first part light Brease
and fine Wither from N.W.
Eleven ships in sight Cape Baring
in sight Baring N.E. party Miles
off heavy ice between us and the
land at 9 P.M. calm saw a
Bawhead Bawd into N.E.
Latter part fresh Brease from
N.E. at 10 P.M. Double Keel'd the
Capsails

Saturday June 11th
This Day first part Blowing
a heavy Brease from N.E.
at 3 P.M. Tacks in the part
Capsail twelve ships in sight
Latter part fine halloo to the
W. and Mastered made all sail
Cape Baring twenty Miles off
Baring N.E. Lat 64-30 N.

Sunday June 12th
This Day first part Blowing
fresh and fine Wither from N.
Several ships chasing Whales
Whales going fast to N.E.
Two ships cutting latter part
Wither much the same at 10 P.M.
saw two Bawheads going to the
Windward quick
Lat 64-13 N. Long 176-15 W.

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Monday June 13th
This Day first part fresh Brease
and fine Wither from N.W.
Employed in looking for
Whales fifteen ships in sight
Latter part light Brease N.E. at 11
saw a Bawhead twelve Bawds in
chase

Tuesday June 14th
This Day first part light Brease
and fine Wither from N.W.
standing off and on the land
Latter part much the same at 10 P.M.
Wither fresh from N.E. With
thick snow spoke the Soline

Wednesday June 15th
This Day first part calm thick
fog at 8 P.M. light Brease
from N.W. Latter part fine
Wither saw two Bawheads going
quick. Lat 64-21 N. off the ice

Thursday June 16th
This Day first part light Brease
and fine Wither from N.W.
Latter part fine halloo to the
S. and thick fog Employed in
beating to Windward several
ships in sight and a plenty
of ice

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
