Friday June 12
This day first part fresh Breeze
and cloudy wither from N.E.
beating to windward in company
with seventeen ships under short
sail latter part thick fog

Saturday June 13
This day first part fresh Breeze
and cloudy wither from N.E.
I saw several Samboes going
quicks to N.E. land fifteen
miles off Baring. at 10 all hands
latter part thick snow storm
running to N.E. at 4 P.M. double
breef to the topsails

Sunday June 14
This day first part fresh Breeze
and thick snow storm from
N.E. at 1 P.M. came N.W. at 6 P.M.
breef to the windward at 10 P.M.
latter part wind moderates made
all sail cloudy wither

Lat 64° 30' N Long 176° 30' W

Monday June 15
This day first part Breeze
beating to N.E. saw several
hip racks to the fifteen miles
off Cape Baring latter part
fresh Breeze from N.E. and thick
wither

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Tuesday June 16
This day first part fresh Breeze and
thick wither from N.E. beating
to windward latter part much
the same

Wednesday June 17
This day first part light Breeze
and thick drizzly wither from
N.E. gaining with the day
latter part calm the Capt. went
on board the day same after and
at the foremast hands came on
the quarter deck with a tub of
clothes and went to washing those
belonging to the recent state
Mr. Drew Mr. Franks the state
told the man to wash some
whores else Mr. Drew got mad
and said that the man should
wash on the quarter deck and
used much bad language the
Capt. not being on board

Thursday June 18
This day first part calm land
in sight of Cape Baring. E.
twenty miles off at 4 P.M. light
Breeze from N.E. came N.W. Bunt
the barbed chain on to the
anchor and catched it
latter part light Breeze steering
N.W. in company with the
Legation
