Sunday July 12
This Day fine weather from the
N.E. Myself the Mate getting better

Monday July 13
This Day first part the weather
fine plenty of ice in the
straits and ships latter part
thick heard several Whales blowing
fog horns

Tuesday July 14
This Day first part light Brease
and fine weather saw several ships
with their Boats down the bringing
up the near my self better at 5 P.M.
loud fire Boats the Capt. went in
the place did not get on the
the Whale being calm at 10 P.M.
Boats came on Board off the
Larance Bay twenty five miles
& from the heads Whales going
into the Bay very light ice and
scattering East Cape and the
Oenmeades in sight Myself and
only at 10 P.M. calm and thick

Wednesday July 15
This Day first part calm head
to the N. light scattering ice all
round East Cape and the
Oenmeades Islands clear to
latter part light Brease and
drisly from the N.E.

Thursday July 16
This Day first part light Brease
and drisly rain from the
N.W. Employed in fitting casks
for weather and working the
ships up to East Cape to get
to discharge at 11 P.M. came to
anchor latter part with much
the same sent the Boats in after
a raft of weather

Friday July 17
This Day first part light Brease
and fine weather from the W.
Employed in working ships
off East Cape got off sixty
lbs at 3 P.M. got under way
course N.W. Wind S. latter part
fine weather at noon thick
fog halted a Boat on the Wind
lat. 64° 00' N long 140° 22' W
