In the Arctic and the compass ground

Saturday July 18
This day first part light breeze
and fog squalls scattering ice
came. W. W. plenty ships in
right latter part calm saw
Bawheads at 9 last part Baw
and M. S. B. struck after took
the whale a long side and cut
him in fresh Brease from the
S. the mate Mr. Parker got
his hand cut by a Burn lance
Englading at the Augil up the
gun Lat 67-40-00' long 171-00-00'

Sunday July 19
This day fresh Brease and Drisly
Rain from the S. plenty of
Whale Bawheads came chasing all
day M. J. B. B. struck and
sawed from him at 1 P.M.
Lat the Markers to going latter
part wither much the same
chasing Whales all day and
Bawling had saw Whales mixed

Monday July 20
This day first part fresh Brease
and thick wither with Rain from
the S. E. Employed in Bawling
and chasing Whales at 4 P.M.
Double Reeped the topsails latter
part thick and Rainy
the ship the mate still sick
with the Bawel complaint

Tuesday July 21
This day first part thick and
Rainy from the S. Employed
in Bawling at 3 P.M. Wier
Moderate and fine wither land
three Bawheads for a Bawhead Wier
very light did not strike latter
part fine wither light Brease
and calms standing down and
chasing Whales Lat 67-5-11-00'
long 171-00-00'

Wednesday July 22
This day first part light Bawling
Brease and fine wither Employed
in standing down ail and
chasing Bawheads ail stand
down 120 lbs latter part fine
Brease and a plenty of Bawheads
land the Baw the J. B. struck
and sawed the whale at midnight
finished cutting
Lat 67-5-5-00' long 171-5-6-00'

Thursday July 23
This day first part fresh Brease
from the E. Employed in Whaling
latter part blowing fresh with
thick Drisly Rain from the E. S. E.
at 10. 00. 00. spoke the mile and
got fine Man Baw head and
Baw steerer ship Bawed Man
from the fact of New Landau
