Sunday Aug. 9
This day first part light
Breeze and fine weather from
N.E. head. S.E. all sail and
in company with several ships
latter part much the same
Lat 68-33. N. Long 171-00 W.

Monday Aug. 10
This day first part light Breeze
and fine weather from N.E.
head. S.E. all sail in sight
and a plenty of drift wood
all sail and latter part wind
N.E. head. S.E. thick fog
Lat 68-58. N. Long 168-00 W.

Tuesday Aug. 11
This day first part fresh Breeze
and thick weather from N.E. head.
S.E. all sail and at 5 P.M.
cleared off light Breeze from
N.E. head. S.E. by E. latter
part calm Lat 68-30. N. Long 168-15 W.

Wednesday Aug. 12
This day first part calm
at 9 P.M. Capt. Thomas came on
board latter part moderate
Breeze and fine weather from N.
head. S.E. by W. Lat 69-00. N.

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Thursday Aug. 13
This day first part fresh
Breeze and fine weather from
N.E. head. S.W. all sail
and latter part wind hauled
to N.W. and a thick fog
at 4. A.M. the fog let up. Made
all sail head. S.E.
Lat 70-15. N. Long 169-10 W.

Friday Aug. 14
This day first part fresh
Breeze and cloudy weather from
N.W. head. S.E. latter part
thick fog under topsails

Saturday Aug. 15
This day first part blowing
fresh from N.W. with thick
weather head. S.E. by E. at 4 P.M.
reared ship head. S.W. double
reefed the topsails and of the
samarit hands same Miller
has been sick all the season
off duty surprised with the
hurricanes inwardly the day
worse latter part weather much
the same at 5. A.M. steering N.W.
made all sails saw plenty
of drift wood
Lat 69-45. N. Long 171-00 W.
