

In the Arctic Ocean 1863

Sunday Aug 16
This Day first part fresh
Breeze and cloudy wither from
the N. came at 4 P.M. all sail and
latter part at 12 Night luffed to
the Wind head to the N.W.
Thick wither Surpassed

Lat 67-50. N Long 173-00. W

Monday Aug 17
This Day first part clear
Breeze and cloudy wither from
the N. head W. at 4 P.M. two sail in
right Bowed to the W. latter part
much the same at 4 P.M. last
to heavy ice heard ships head
E. at 1 P.M. Lat 70-05. N Long 174-25. W

Tuesday Aug 18
This Day first part fresh Breeze
and cloudy wither from the N.
at 3 P.M. came E. at 5 P.M. Lat 70-00. N Long 175-00. W
latter part thick at 9 P.M. Wind
freshened luffed to the Wind head
E. at 1 P.M. Double reefed the Tapsails
at 1 P.M. took in the fore
Tapsail Blowing fresh

Wednesday Aug 19
This Day first part Blowing
a gale from the N. with thick
rainy wither under light sail
at 11 P.M. Wind Moderated to a
calm at 10 P.M. Wind Bore up
from the S.E. and freshened Double
reefed the Tapsails latter part

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Blowing a gale head E. at 1 P.M.
at 2 P.M. luffed the fore Tapsail
and last reefed the main at
3 P.M. turned and reefed and up
the main Tapsail set the fore
Tapsail last reefed

Lat 69-17. N Long 173-10. W

Thursday Aug 20
This Day first part Blowing
a gale and clear wither from
the S.E. head E. at 1 P.M. under Double
reefed main Tapsail and last
reefed fore at 3 P.M. shipped a sea
which stove the S.B.B. all the
peaces cranes davits stanchions
main rail a Breast the Boat and
the starboard side parrel hat
to stove holes through the
bulwarks on the starboard side
up the ship to get the water off
Decks at 7 P.M. moderated a little
on ship in right latter part
wither much the same when the
sea struck the ship it stove
conceivable sheathing appap
the starboard side in the waist
and one beam under the fore
Decks in the fore peak and
one Boat Barrer on the starboard
side from 6 P.M. to 1 P.M.
took in rail several times
at 8 P.M. heard ship head
S.E. at 1 P.M. Lat 69-40. N Long 173-02. W

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
