

In the Arctic Ocean 1863

Thursday Aug 27
This day first part Madreat
Breeze and cloudy wither from
the S. gaining with the Yakous
Espiratus Marthey Yaney the
Yaney pull plenty of Whales
to the N. at 10 P.M. Our gaining
course. N.W. by N all sail and later
part fine wither course. N.W. by N
saw the Carinthian cutting and
the Marthey picked up a dead
Whale and one ship Bauling
Lat 70-30 N long 171-19 W

Friday Aug 28
This day first part light
Breeze and fine wither from
the S.E. came. N.W. by N in company
with the Yakous and Espiratus
Marthey Brunswick at 9 P.M.
thick fog thick in light
sails and luffed to our the
Wind head S.S.W. latter part
thick till 7 A.M. clear up and
sail head. N. fresh Breeze
surpassed Lat 71-20 N long 171-00 W

Saturday Aug 29
This day first part fresh Breeze
and drizzly wither from the E. N. E.
in company with the Yakous Marthey
Espiratus had a gain at 4 P.M.
made sail head S.E. latter part
thick drizzly wither the Capt. of the
Ocean came on Board reports seen
plenty of Whales off Herald Head

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Sunday Aug 30
This day first part light Breeze
and thick drizzly wither from
the N.E. heading to the S.E. five
ships in sight all standing to
the S.E. latter part fresh Breeze
and cloudy wither from the S.
Duple reefed the Main Tapsail
and last reefed the fore Tapsail
head. E. Lat 70-31 N long 171-21 W

Monday Aug 31
This day first part Madreat
Breeze and cloudy wither from
the S.E. head S.S.W. in company
with the Yakous and Espiratus
fine sail in sight latter part
fresh Breeze from the S.W. head
S.S.E. Lat 70-10 N long 172-30 W

Tuesday Sept 1
This day first part Madreat
Breeze and fine wither from
the S. head to the East Duple
reefed fore Tapsail at 3 P.M.
gaining with the Yakous and
Espiratus at 5 P.M. saw a
Bowhead larval nine Boats and
Tuck chase galled the Whale
Boats. came on Board at 7 P.M.
course. N.E. Whale Breeze. S.S.E.
at 10 P.M. all three ships halled
a Boat for the Night latter part
wither much the same at 7 A.M.
made sail course. N.E.
Lat 70-20 N long 171-10 W
