Thursday Sept^r 10
This Day first part light
Breeze and fine weather from the
N. E. all sail and went
to Stuckensail at 8 P.M. East Cape
Bering S. by W. eight Miles off Taw
sails in sight latter part Blowing
fresh from the N. W. with heavy
weather two sail in sight

Lat 64-55-N Long 171-40-W

Friday Sept^r 11
This Day first part fresh gale
and fine weather from the N. E.
came S. at 6 P.M. spoke the Bark
Yamalane at 7 P.M. under Main
Topsail bare Topsail Double Reefed
and foresail Indian paint
Bering W. ten Miles off came S. W.
latter part cloudy with Blowing
fresh came S. by E.

Saturday Sept^r 12
This Day first part fresh Breeze
and thick weather from the N. E.
at 4 P.M. wind on Board of the
Yamalane and got fifteen Barrels
of Water at 9 P.M. got the Water
on Board and made all sail
in company with the Yamalane
came S. W. by S. Topsail Stuckensail
and latter part thick Drizzle
weather from the E. Main
Topsail Stuckensail and
surpassed Lat 64-20-N Long 174-42-W

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Sunday Sept^r 13
This Day first part Moderate
Breeze and thick Drizzle weather
from the E. came S. W. by S. all
sail and employed in stowing
away the cutting gear and empty
casks latter part Wind light and
weather much the same

Monday Sept^r 14
This Day first part light Breeze
and thick Drizzle weather from
the N. E. came S. W. by S. all sail
and at 4 P.M. saw a sail bound
to the S. S. W. at 3 P.M. came S. S. W.
latter part cloudy with caps
Gray of the Yamalane came
on Board and stayed all Day

Tuesday Sept^r 15
This Day first part light
Breeze and cloudy weather from
the N. E. came S. W. by S. all sail
and employed in stowing
away stuff off decks latter
part Wind halled to N. W.

Lat 5-48-N Long 175-20-W

Wednesday Sept^r 16
This Day first part fresh Breeze
and clear weather from the N. E.
at 7 P.M. under Double Reefed
bare Topsail and carriers came S. W.
latter part Wind halled to the
N. at 4 A.M. calm and sail in
sight went a new mainsail
Lat 5-55-N Long 172-56-W
