Thursday Sept^r 17
This Day first part calm
and fine weather employed in
fitting ships and of the Meyer
crastres brake and one of the
trusseltrees at 7 P.M. light Brease
and fine weather from the S.E.
came S.W. by S. at 9 P.M. wind freshened
and halled to the S.E. latter
part fresh Brease at 6 A.M. Sat
all the Studensails

Lat 5° 45' N. Long 170° 23' E

Friday Sept 18
This Day first part light Brease
and fine weather from the S.E.
came S.W. by S. all sail and a
heavy swell from the S.E. at 11 P.M.
Wind halled to the S.W. Tuck in
the Studensails latter part
fresh Brease from the S.W. head
to the S.S.E. at 11 A.M. Double reefed
the Topsails Lat 5° 34' N. Long 170° 00' E

Saturday Sept 19
This Day first part fresh Brease
and cloudy weather from the
S.W. head S.S.E. at 2 P.M. reared ship
head W.N.W. at 4 P.M. Wind moderated
and halled to the S.W. came S.W. by W.
Made all sail heavy swell and
latter part calm at 5 A.M. Wind
from the S.E. and a thick rain
at 9 A.M. Tuck in the Studensails
Blowing fresh
Surfaced Lat 5° 22' N. Long 169° 40'

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Sunday Sept 20
This Day first part fresh Brease
and fine weather from the S.E.
came S.W. by E. all sail and at 8 P.M.
Wind very light latter part Wind
halled to the S.E. head S.S.W.

Monday Sept 21
This Day first part light Baffling
Brease from the S. reared ship
several times latter part fresh
Brease and cloudy weather from the
S.E. head S.E. at 11 A.M. Double
reefed the Topsails

Tuesday Sept 22
This Day first part fresh gale
from the S.E. at 6 P.M. commenced
raining. Boat reefed the fore
Topsail and furled the courses
head S.S.E. latter part fine weather
at 4 A.M. fresh Brease from
the S.W. came S.E. at 6 A.M.
Made sail

Wednesday Sept 23
This Day first part fresh Brease
and fine weather from the S.W.
came S.E. at 8 P.M. Wind halled
to the S.S.W. Tuck in the Studensails and
latter part fresh Brease and
squally from the S.W.

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
