Friday Oct. 2
This day first part light Breeze
and fine weather from the
N.W. came S.E. & employed in
mending all sails latter part
Madrat gale from the S.W.
head E.S.E. Employed in Washing
Bare

Saturday Oct. 3
This day first part fresh
gale from the S.W. came E.S.E.
at 6 P.M. last reefed the
top sails latter part made sail
and tucked in several times
heavy rain squales from
the W.N.W. came S.E.

Sunday Oct. 4
This day first part fresh
Breeze and frequent rain
squales from the W.N.W.
came S.E. Made sail and tucked
it in several times latter part
Madrat Breeze and fine weather
got the Bare on deck and set
the stud sails

Monday Oct. 5
This day first part light
Breeze and fine weather from
the N.W. came S.E. all sail
out at 6 P.M. squally shorted
sail latter part fine weather all
sail out employed in repairing
all sails and cleaning all
trails

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Tuesday Oct. 6
This day first part light Breeze
and fine weather from the N.W. came
S.E. all sail and employed
in drying lines and ships duty
latter part much the same

Wednesday Oct. 7
This day first part light Breeze
and fine weather from the W.
came S.E. & employed in drying
Bare and Bundling latter part
weather much the same employed in
mending sails and scraping hale

Thursday Oct. 8
This day first part light Breeze
and fine weather from the N.W.
came S.E. & employed in mending
all sails and scraping hale
latter part much the same
at 6 A.M. light Breeze from
the N.E. saw a sail standing
to the E. Ward

Friday Oct. 9
This day first part light
Breeze and fine weather from
the N.E. came S.E. & all sail
out employed in mending sails
and scraping latter part much
the same employed in Washing
ship

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
