

Sunday August the 22th 1858.
all these 24 hours light winds from the South
and fine weather steering to the Eastward
a pinback Lat 35-26 Long 47-10



Monday the 23th
begins with light winds from the S.E.
and pleasant weather steering to the Eastward
middle part the same latter part fine
at 8 PM saw two large sperm whales
towered and struck to the waist boat
a schooner in sight 30 miles

Tuesday the 24th
begins with light winds from the S.E. the boats
off and past to a whale at 1 PM we got the
whale to the ship at 4 began to cut middle
part lay by latter part employed in cutting
spoke the schooner John Adams of Providence
Capt Cook 4 months out with 50 blb sperm

Lat 36-00 Long 45-10

Wednesday the 25th
begins with calms at 2 PM finished cutting
middle and latter parts employed in boiling
saw nothing Lat 36-21 Long 44-50

Thursday the 26th
begins with calms employed in boiling middle
part light winds from the S.E. latter part made
the same two mile in sight

Lat 36-18 Long 43-48

Friday the 27th
begins with light winds from the S.E. and
fine weather steering to the Eastward by the wind
employed in boiling at 7 PM finished
a ship in sight

Lat 36-56 Long 42-35

Saturday the 28th 1858
begins with moderate gales from the S.E. by S and
fine weather steering to the Eastward by the wind
saw nothing employed in repairing the menceing
Machene no obs Lat 37-15 Long 41-00

Sunday the 29th
begins with moderate gales from the S.E. and
fine weather steering to the Eastward by the
wind saw nothing Lat 38-50 Long 39-28

Monday the 30th
all these 24 hours light winds from the S.E. and
fine weather steering to the Eastward by the
wind saw nothing Lat 39-39 Long 38-50

Tuesday the 31st
all these 24 hours light winds from the South
and fine weather steering to the S.E. saw
groups of two mile in sight

Lat 39-25 Long 38-10

Wednesday the 1st Sept
all these 24 hours light winds from the S.W. and
fine weather steering S.E. at 4 PM spoke the
Bark S.D. Chase of Beverly Capt Ryder 15
months out with 300 blb whale and groups
and blackfish Lat 39-12 Long 35-05

Thursday the 2nd
begins with light winds from the S.W. and
fine weather steering to the Eastward middle
part lay by latter part steering S.E. at
6 PM we saw the Islands of Flores and Curacao
Lat 39-10 Long 34-40
