equally rainy weather steering by the wind  
var nothing Lat 17-50 Long 36-10

Saturday the 25<sup>th</sup>  
all these 24 hours strong variable winds and  
thick rainy weather steering various ways  
No obs

Sunday the 26<sup>th</sup>  
all these 24 hours strong variable winds  
with thick weather and much rain  
No obs

Monday the 27<sup>th</sup>  
begins with strong gales from the South  
and rainy weather middle part much the same  
latter part calm  
Lat 18-55 Long 36-10

Tuesday the 28<sup>th</sup>  
begins with calm middle and latter  
parts light winds from the N.E. and  
fine weather steering to the N.W. several  
miles in sight Lat 18-41 Long 36-37

Wednesday November the 3<sup>rd</sup> 1858  
all these 24 hours light winds from the N.E.  
and pleasant weather steering by the wind  
spoke the Bark Richmond Capt Chessey  
13 months out with 25 bbls Opium and 100 W  
Lat 15-00 Long 44-23

Thursday the 4<sup>th</sup>  
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the N.E.  
and fine weather steering one way and the  
other by the wind some several miles  
Lat 15-52 Long 36-40

Friday the 5<sup>th</sup>  
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and fine  
weather steering one way and the other some  
humpbacks Lat 15-58 Long 36-58

Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup>  
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and  
calms steering by the wind some humpbacks  
Lat 18-45 Long 36-30

Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup>  
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and  
fine weather steering S.E. some humpbacks  
Lat 20-15 Long 36-10

Monday the 8<sup>th</sup>  
begins with moderate gales from the N.E. and  
pleasant weather steering to the S.E. some a  
large ship steering to the Eastward  
Lat 22-00 Long 38-00

Tuesday the 9<sup>th</sup>  
begins with moderate gales from the N.E. and  
fine weather steering S.E. latter part brisk  
gales from the S.W. and equally with rain
