

Wednesday November the 10th 1855
begins with brisk gales from the S.W. and
usually rainy weather steering to the E.S.E.
middle part light winds with rain latter
part light winds and pleasant

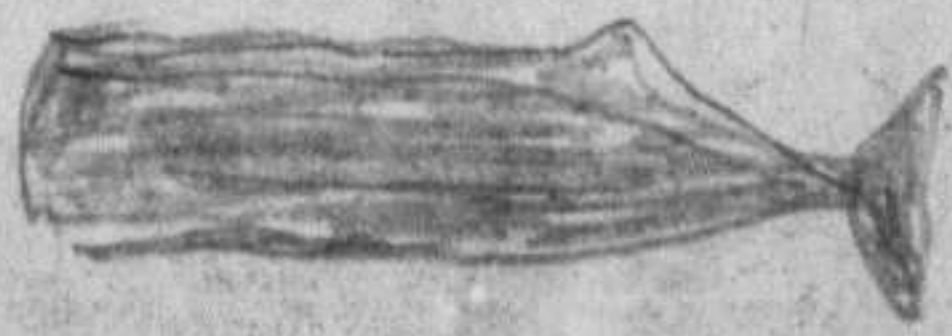
Lat 22-30 Long 28-30

Thursday the 11th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the South
and pleasant weather steering E.S.E. saw a sail
to the S.W. Lat 23-10 Long 26-40

Friday the 12th
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the S.W.
steering S.W. by the wind saw a sail
Lat 22-53 Long 25-12

Saturday the 13th
begins with brisk gales from the S.W. with
squalls steering S.W. by the wind middle
part the same at 6 P.M. saw a sperm
Whale going quick to the N.W. at 9
lowered three boats and chased
Lat 24-19 Long 26-56

Sunday the 14th
begins with moderate gales from the S.W. and
pleasant weather the boats off in chase of a
large Whale at 1 P.M. struck to the lumbered
boat at 5 got the Whale along side middle
part brisk gales and usually latter part
usually and rigged employed in cutting
Lat 24-13 Long 27-25



Monday November the 15th 1855
begins with brisk gales and usually squally
weather employed in cutting at 5 P.M. got the
head off and haled in middle log by latter rigged
took in the head and wore ship to the S.W.

Lat 24-00 Long 29-40

Tuesday the 16th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the S.W.
and good weather heading to the S.W. employed
in hauling Lat 24-44 Long 29-20

Wednesday the 17th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the S.W.
and good weather steering to the S.W. employed in
hauling Lat 25-08 Long 26-45

Thursday the 18th
begins with moderate gales from the S.W.
and good weather steering S.W. employed in
hauling at 9 P.M. finished middle and
latter parts good weather a sail in sight
at 12 P.M. saw sperm Whales
Lat 25-29 Long 25-31



Friday the 19th
begins with moderate gales from the S.W. and
good weather sperm Whales in sight at 1 P.M.
lowered and got one to the first boat at
4 got the Whale along side middle part rainy
Lat stopped 50 bbls of oil at 9 began to cut
Lat 25-42 Long 25-20

Saturday the 20th
begins with moderate gales from the South
and thick weather employed in cutting at 6
P.M. finished middle part log by latter part
hauling with a heavy swell from the S.W.
Lat 25-31 Long 25-16
