all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
calms with showers of rain steering to the
westward Lat 18-15 Long 42-38

Thursday the 10th
begins with light winds from the S.W. and
thick cloudy weather steering to the westward
middle and latter parts light baffling winds
and calms with squalls of wind and rain
steering to the S.W.

Lat 18-20 Long 42-30

Friday the 11th
all these 24 hours moderate baffling winds and
squally weather with much rain steering to the
S.W. saw a Bark steering to the Eastward

Lat 18-58 Long 41-50

Saturday the 12th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the S.W.
and squally rugged weather steering S.W.

Lat 20-25 Long 41-38

Sunday the 13th
begins with strong gales from the W.S.W. and
rugged squally weather middle and latter parts
more moderate steering South by the wind true
Sail in sight Lat 21-34 Long 41-26

Monday the 14th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
calms steering to the South two miles in sight

Lat 25-50 Long 41-50

Tuesday the 15th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
calms steering to the South a Brig in sight

Lat 26-42 Long 42-00

Wednesday February the 16th 1859
all these 24 hours light baffling winds from S.W. to
S.E. with squalls of rain steering to the S.W.

Lat 22-15 Long 42-12

Thursday the 17th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the S.W. and
good weather steering to the S.W. by the wind

Lat 23-25 Long 41-10

Friday the 18th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the S.W. and
good weather steering S.W. saw porpoises

Lat 24-26 Long 39-40

Saturday the 19th
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the S.W. with
showers of rain steering to the S.W.

Lat 26-24 Long 38-06

Sunday the 20th
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the S.W. steering
to the Westward at 6 P.M. saw the Land bearing
West 20 miles distant latter part thick weather

Lat 26-10 Long 38-12

Monday the 21st
begins with brisk gales from the S.W. and
rugged steering to the North at 8 P.M. saw the Land
bore West distant 5 miles middle part strong
gales steering S.W. and carrying sail hard to
escape of shore latter part lying to

Lat 26-12 Long 34-12

Tuesday the 22nd
begins with strong gales from the S.W. and
rugged weather steering to the North middle part
calm by heading S.E. latter steering West the Land in
sight Lat 25-50 Long 35-00
