all these 24 hours brisk gales from the SE and
ragged weather steering by the wind and nothing
Lat 3-20 Long 55-50

Friday the 27th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the SE
and ragged weather steering by the wind
Lat 3-23 Long 55-20

Saturday the 28th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the SE and
usually ragged weather steering one way and
the other saw the Land
no lbs

Sunday the 29th
begins with strong gales from the SE and
ragged usually weather steering by the wind
middle and latter parts more moderate the
Land in sight Lat 3-30 Long 56-20

Monday the 30th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the SE
and variable weather steering by the wind
a veil and the Land in sight saw blackfish
Lat 3-22 Long 55-50

Tuesday the 31st
all these 24 hours strong gales from the SE
and ragged weather steering one way and the
other by the wind a veil and the Land in sight
Lat 3-23 Long 56-16

Wednesday June the 1st 1859
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the SE and
usually weather steering by the wind
Lat 3-22 Long 55-50

Thursday the 2nd
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the SE and
ragged weather steering by the wind saw nothing
Lat 3-23 Long 56-30

Friday the 3rd
all these 24 hours strong gales from the SE and
ragged weather steering by the wind the Land in
sight Lat 3-32 Long 56-36

Saturday the 4th
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the SE and
ragged weather steering W by the wind saw porpoises
Lat 4-16 Long 54-26

 Sunday the 5th
begins with strong gales from the SE and ragged
weather steering to the SE at 3 PM saw sperm
Whales the first seen for six months and fifteen
days lowered and got one to the starboard
boat at 8 got the whale to the ship middle
part lay by latter part employed in cutting at
11 got the head off and body in
Lat 4-18 Long 53-36

Monday the 6th
begins with brisk gales from the SE and ragged
weather at 2 got the head in middle and
latter parts employed in bailing heading
to the W by the wind
Lat 4-36 Long 52-56
