and the other by the wind near the land

Tuesday the 19th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the South
and rugged weather steering by the wind
Lat 14-32 Long 40-55

Wednesday the 20th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the
South and rugged weather steering by the
wind over the land
Lat 15-15 Long 40-20

Thursday the 21st
begins with strong gales from the South
and rugged weather steering North middle
part heading to the Eastward latter part
steering N by E Lat 14-30 Long 41-20

Friday the 22nd
begins with strong gales from the South
and rugged weather steering N by W middle
part steering to the Eastward latter part
steering N by W the land in sight
Lat 14-58 Long 40-10

Saturday the 23rd
begins with brisk gales and rugged weather
steering to the Northward
Lat 13-28 Long 41-18

Sunday the 24th 1852
begins with brisk gales from the S by E and
rugged weather steering N by W middle part
latter part strong gales from the South
lying to heading to the Eastward
Lat 13-11 Long 41-20

Monday the 25th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the
South and rugged weather lying to
heading to the Eastward
Lat 13-19 Long 42-05

Tuesday the 26th
begins with strong gales from the South and
rugged weather steering to the Eastward middle
and latter parts more moderate
No obs Long 43-10

Wednesday the 27th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the S by E and
rugged weather steering one way and
the other by the wind
No obs Long 43-10

Thursday the 28th
begins with strong gales from the S by E and
rugged weather steering one way and
the other by the wind latter part moderate
Lat 13-44 Long 42-30

Friday the 29th
begins with moderate gales from the South and
good weather steering to the Eastward by
the wind middle part brisk gales with
squalls of rain latter part much the same
steering to the Eastward
Lat 12-38 Long 41-58
