begins with light winds from the S.W. and
good weather at 4 P.M. came to anchor
at Johanna

Thursday the 18th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the South
and squally weather employed in getting
off land

Friday the 19th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the South
employed in getting off water and recruits

Saturday the 20th
begins fine weather employed in getting
ready for sea at 6 A.M. got under way
with light airs from the South steering
to the North

Sunday the 21st
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
calms with fine weather steering N.E.
Lat 11 24 Long 44 53

Monday the 22nd
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
calms steering N.E. a sail in sight
Lat 10 54 Long 44 20

Tuesday the 23rd
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
calms steering N.E. at 12 M. saw 3 sperm
Whales lowered and chased a ship in sight
Lat 10 01 Long 44 10



Wednesday August the 24th 1859
begins with light baffling winds and calms the
boats off in chase of Whales got on the
Eastward boat at 5 P.M. got the Whales to the
Whip middle part lay by at 6 A.M. saw more
Whales lowered and got two to the Eastward
and West boats at 12 M. got the Whales to
the ship Lat 10 01 Long 43 58

Thursday the 25th
begins fine weather employed in cutting and
first lay by latter part finished cutting
and began to hail a Vail sight
Lat 9 56 Long 43 47

Friday the 26th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
calms steering to the Eastward employed in
hailing Lat 9 56 Long 43 32

Saturday the 27th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
fine weather steering to the Eastward employed
in hailing Lat 9 23 Long 43 45

Sunday the 28th
begins with light winds from the South
and fine weather steering to the Eastward
at 7 P.M. finished hailing saw a Vail
to the North Lat 8 05 Long 44 01

Monday the 29th
all these 24 hours light winds from the S.W. and
fine weather steering by the wind
Lat 9 16 Long 44 25
