

Tuesday February the 9th 1861
begins with calm middle and latter
parts light baffling winds and good
weather steering to the Eastward spoke
the back Hope Capt Macfarlane 6 months
out of Glen Lat 4-16 Long 54-20

Wednesday the 9th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
calms steering S.E. the Long in sight
Lat 4-52 Long 55-00

Thursday the 9th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds
and calms steering to the N.E. Make in
sight Lat 4-25

Friday the 10th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds
and good weather at 12 M arrived of the
harbour of Make and took a pilot

Saturday the 11th
begins with light winds from the N.W.
and fine weather at 2 P.M. came to
anchor at Make and lay there until
the 14th the two last days wind hauled

Sunday the 11th
begins with light winds from the North
middle part much the same at 8 M
got under way and the pilot came on
board the ground where we lay about
15 minutes started 14 bbls of water and
got off at 9 discharged the pilot
and stood to the Eastward

Saturday the 25th 1861
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the N.W.
and good weather steering S.E. saw finbacks
Lat 5-01 Long 57-20

Sunday the 26th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the S.E.
and good weather steering S.E. saw finbacks
Lat 5-25 Long 59-00

Monday the 27th
all these 24 hours light winds from the S.E.
and fine weather steering S.E. saw porpoises
Lat 4-45 Long 60-00

Tuesday the 28th
begins with light winds from the North and
fine weather steering S.E. by 1 middle part the
same latter part equally with rain
No obs Lat 4-20 Long 61-25

Wednesday the 29th
all these 24 hours thick equally weather
with rain steering one way and the other
by the wind saw porpoises
No obs Lat 4-30 Long 61-20

Thursday March the 1st
all these 24 hours baffling winds and equally
weather with rain steering one way and the other
saw a Back a Whaler and the bottom
Lat 5-07 Long 61-00

Friday the 2nd
all these 24 hours baffling winds and equally
weather with rain thunder and lightning plenty
saw two Dail
Lat 5-35 Long 60-50
