all these 24 hours strong gales from the
N^W and rugged nasty rainy weather heading
by the wind two sail in sight

Lat 9-35 Long 66-05

Sunday the 4th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the N^W
and equally rainy rugged weather steering
by the wind two sail in sight

Lat 9-36 Long 66-40

Monday the 5th
begins with strong gales from the N^W and
equally rainy weather steering to the N^W &
middle part much the same latter part
more moderate steering to the S^W

Lat 8-52 Long 66-20

Tuesday the 6th
begins with brisk gales from the N^W and
rugged weather steering to the S^W middle
and latter parts moderate and pleasant
a sail in sight

Lat 8-50 Long 66-40

Wednesday the 7th
begins with light baffling winds and
fine weather steering to the South at 5 PM
In spoke the Bark Marcella Captain Ellis
18th months out with 350 bbls sperm oil
middle part calm latter part light winds
from the N^W two sail in sight

Moobs Lat 9-12 Long 66-36

Thursday March the 8th 1860
all these 24 hours light baffling winds and
cloudy weather at 5 PM saw the Bark
Governor Harver of Westport chasing sperm
Whales at 5 PM saw the Whales middle part
cut by latter part three sail in sight
one a Sherchenman saw a barke with
her boats down apparently chasing
Whales

Lat 9-38 Long 66-53



Friday the 9th
begins with light baffling winds and
cloudy weather at 1 PM saw Whales
lowered and got two one to the Starboard
and one to the Waist boat at 8 PM
got the Whales to the Ship middle part
cut by latter part employed in cutting at 10 AM
got one Whale in at 11 AM rain 20 ends
No Obs Lat 9-53 Long 66-54



Saturday the 10th
begins with moderate baffling winds and
cloudy weather employed in cutting at 4 PM
In finished middle and latter parts five
weather employed in boiling two Barks in
sight boiling probably the Marcella and
Governor Harver

Lat 9-54 Long 66-55

Sunday the 11th
begins with light baffling winds and calms
steering to the N^W employed in boiling middle
and latter parts much the same with showers
of rain two sail in sight saw the bottom
in 12 fathoms of water

No Obs Lat 10-00 Long 66-57
