calms saw blackfish the Tucker in sight

and calms steering to the westward
the Tucker in sight

all these 24 hours light baffling winds
and calms working to the westward the
Tucker in sight Lat 3-00 Long 55-56

Wednesday the 23rd
all these 24 hours light baffling winds
and calms working to the westward two
Miles in sight no obs Lat 3-05 Long 55-58
56-15

Thursday the 24th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds
and calms working to the westward with
not wind enough to stem the current
Lat 3-12 Long 56-32

Friday the 25th
all these 24 hours light baffling winds
and calms steering to the westward
Lat 3-23 Long 56-40

Saturday the 26th
begins with calms middle part light
winds from the SSW latter part much
the same steering SSW spoke the Bark
President Capt Woodell 11 months
out with 100 bbls sperm oil

Lat 3-34 Long 5-10

Sunday the 27th
begins with moderate gales but baffling
with signals of rain the Bark in sight
steering SSW three miles in sight
