the wind Lat 1 35 Long 48 40

Friday the 15th
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the
South and rugged weather steering to
the Westward by the wind

Lat 7 12 Long 46 20

Saturday the 16th
begins with strong gales from the S by E
and rugged weather steering to the Westward
middle and latter parts steering to the
Eastward Lat 7 13 Long 46 45

Sunday the 17th
begins with strong gales from the South
and rugged weather steering to the Eastward
by the wind at 9 a.m. backed to the S.W.

Lat 7 15 Long 47 20

Monday the 18th
all these 24 hours strong gales from the S by E
and rugged weather steering to the S.W.
by the wind Lat 8 48 Long 46 12

Tuesday the 19th
begins with brisk gales from the S by E
and rugged weather steering S.W. to middle
and latter parts light winds from the
South steering S.W. by the wind

Lat 10 00 Long 44 38

Wednesday June the 20th 1861
begins with strong gales from the South and
rugged weather steering to the Westward by the
wind middle and latter parts steering to the
S by E but the main wind employed in
repairing the main part

Lat 10 27 Long 44 55

Thursday the 21st
begins with brisk gales from the South
steering S by E middle part light variable
winds with much rain latter part
strong gales from the S by E at 12 m. wind
Johnna bearing S by E 25 miles distant

Lat 11 27 Long 44 35

Friday the 22nd
all these 24 hours strong gales from the S by E
and rugged weather steering by the wind the
Land in sight Lat 12 00 Long 43 55

Saturday the 23rd
begins with strong gales from the S by E and
rugged weather steering to the Eastward by the
wind middle and latter parts light baffling
winds at 11 a.m. anchored at Johnna in
12 fathoms of water

From the 23rd to the 24th fully
Lying at Johnna

Sunday the 24th
begins with calms at 11 a.m. got
underway steering to the North at day
light Vanua hook bound in to
Johnna
