

Wednesday June the 19th 1811
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the
SSE and rugged weather steering N by E
Lat 18-41 Long 2-06

Thursday the 20th
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the
SE and rugged weather steering N by E
Lat 18-11 Long 00-40 West

Friday the 21st
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the
SE and rugged heavy weather steering
N by E at 6 am Lat 17-46 Long 2-53

Saturday the 22nd
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the SE
and rugged squally weather steering N by E
at 6 am saw the Island of St Helena
bearing N by E 23 miles distant at 12 noon
anchored in 13 fathoms of water

Sunday Morning July the 1st 1811
begins with brisk gales from the SE and
squally weather at 3 PM got underway
at St Helena steering N by E middle and
latter parts the same viz sail in sight
Lat 14-39 Long 7-55

Wednesday the 1st
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the
SE and good weather steering N by E and
back steering to the Westward saw promontories
Lat 13-11 Long 82-56

Thursday the 11th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the
SE and good weather steering N by E and
back to the Westward Lat 11-54 Long 70-20

Friday the 12th
all these 24 hours moderate buffing winds
with showers of rain steering N by E
saw pinbacks Lat 10-49 Long 68-32

Saturday the 13th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the
E by E and variable weather steering N by E
saw porpoises Lat 9-00 Long 62-47

Sunday the 14th
all these 24 hours brisk gales from the E by E
and good weather steering N by E saw nothing
Lat 7-03 Long 52-48

Monday the 15th
all these 24 hours moderate gales from the
SE and good weather steering to the SE by SE
saw a pinback
Lat 5-20 Long 40-30
