

Bark Sea Fox Cruising on New Holland

Thursday April 3rd 1862 Comes in with fresh trades and Squally Weather the Bark on different tracks. Middle and latter part more moderate saw nothing of any description. Ends with Good weather
Lat 27.00 Long 108.20.

Friday April 4th This day Comes in with fresh Easterly Winds the Bark on different tracks. Middle and latter part much the same saw nothing. Ends with fresh Breezes from the S.E.
Lat 27.16 S Long 108.38 E

Saturday April 5th This day Comes in with light Winds from the Eastward the Bark on different track middle and latter part much the same saw nothing but porpoises. on vessel in sight
Lat 28. Long 108.52

Sunday April 6th. Comes in with light Breezes from the Eastward the Bark Steering to the South. Middle and latter part much the same nothing seen of importance
Lat 27.34 S Long 108.46 E

Monday April 7th Comes in with light trades and fine Weather the Bark Steering off N.W. middle and latter part much the same, saw an English Steamer. Steering S.E. with Colors half mast. did not want any assistance
Lat 27.18 Long 108.27 E

Tuesday April 8th Comes in with fine Weather and moderate Winds from S.E. Steering N.W. at 5 P.M. saw Whales going to the North to late to get to them. Covered the Boats and Chased until dark.

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Wednesday April 9th Comes in with fine Weather and light trades. the Bark Steering off North at 8 A.M. More S.W. to the S.W. at 9 A.M. saw Whales going Slow to the North. The Waist Boat Went up and got a Slight iron in. was fast a few minutes and drew back. So ends a bad days work
Lat 26.30 S Long 107.44

Thursday April 10th Comes in with fine Weather and light Breezes from S.E. the Bark Steering off North in Chase of Whales. at day light saw them going quick to the North toward all the Boats the Lead boat Struck and Saved a 60 barrel Whale, and got him to the Ship about noon. in the afternoon Cut him in and Commenced boiling. Lat 25.38 Long 107.52 E

Friday April 11th This day Comes in with good Weather and moderate Winds from the North the Bark Steering to the South killing a Sperm Whale. She heaving in sight to the Southward saw one finback. finished boiling at 3 P.M.
Lat 26.20 S Long 108.06

Saturday April 12th. Fine Weather and variable Winds. the Bark Steering to the S.E. She heaving in sight. to the Southward. Ends with light air from the South.
Lat 26.40 S Long 108.19 E

Sunday April 13th Comes in with fine Weather and moderate breeze from the Southward. middle and latter part much the same. Steering off N.W. She heaving in Company. Saw porpoises and then local fog.
Lat 26.25 S Long 107.40 E
