Monday Jan 26th 1863. Comes in with fine weather and moderate Breezes from S. E. The Bark on different tacks. Middle and latter part much the same. at 2 P.M. Squared away for King Georges Sound and Anchored about 4 P.M. in 14 fathoms

Tuesday Jan 27th Comes in with fine weather and moderate breezes from the S.W. The Bark at anchor in King Georges Sound.

Saturday Jan 31st Comes in with light air from the S.W. at daylight get under weigh with the land breeze. latter part steering S.E. employed Stowing Chains and anchors. Saw a Bark. Spoke Bark Heathen. Lat 35.10 Long 118.15 E

Sunday February 1st Comes in with fine weather and moderate Breezes from the S.W. Middle and latter part the wind blowing quite fresh from the Westward. End with strong Breezes. The Bark Heathen in sight. Lat 35.30

Monday Feb 2nd Comes in with fresh Breezes from the S.W. The Bark on different tacks Middle and latter part. The wind veering to the Southward. Steering W. by S. one vessel in sight. Saw no fish Bent a new foresail. Lat 35.35 Long 117.52 E

Tuesday Feb 3rd Comes in with fresh breeze from S. E. Steering W. S. W. Middle and latter part quite moderate at day light Saw Whales going West. Middle and latter part calm. Looked the three Boats. The Starboard Boat Struck and Lost line at ends with no whale. Bald head in sight bearing N. E. 25 miles

Wednesday Feb 4th Comes in with fine weather the Bark under short sail Steering West at day light Saw Whales and looked all the Boats. The Starboard Boat Struck a large whale out of a school of small ones and killed him and took him to the ship about 11 A.M. after dinner Commenced Cutting got the Saw in and had nearly off. Lashed down for the night. West Cape Howe in sight bearing N. N. E. 30 miles

Thursday Feb 5th Comes in with strong Easterly winds and rough weather all hands employed Cutting. Saw several Merchantmen, latter part baling Cases. Lat 35.30 Long 116.03

Friday Feb 6th Comes in with strong Breeze from E. N. E. and rough weather the Bark heading to the S. E. all hands employed Baling. Middle and latter part fine weather saw nothing of the fish kind. passed a Spar in the water that looked like a Ships lower mast. Saw Murre and men. Steering to the North. Lat 36.10 Long 116.13
