Saturday March 21st 1863. This day comes in with fresh breezes from S.E. the Bark on different tacks. Middle and latter part much the same saw nothing of importance. Ends with good breezes
Lat 27.40 Long 108.25 E

Sunday March 22nd These twenty four hours fine weather and moderate breezes from the Southward. The Bark on different tacks. Middle and latter part much the same saw nothing of importance. Ends with fine weather
Lat 27.20 Long 108.00 E

Monday March 23rd This day comes in with moderate breezes from W. by S. the Bark on different tacks at 2 P.M. Saw Whales going on where towards the Harbor boat. The Whale saw the Boat and left about 4 P.M. The Harbor Boat struck and saved a forty barrel Whale and took him to the ship about 5 P.M. Cut off the heads and rolled the body in and set the watch
Lat 26.35 Long 108.20 E

Tuesday March 24th Comes in with fine weather and moderate breezes from the South the Bark heading to the W.S.W. Middle and latter part employed boiling saw nothing of importance
Lat 26.09 Long 108.16 E

Wednesday March 25th Comes in with fresh breezes from S.E. The watch employed boiling heads ends with fresh breezes

Lat 26.40 Long 107.14 E

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Thursday March 26th Comes in with moderate breezes from the S.E. the Bark on different tacks. Saw nothing but one finback. At noon tacked to the Eastward. Ends with squally weather passed a large vessel under Sary masts. The watch employed boiling.
Lat 27.30 Long 106.32 E

Friday March 27th Comes in with quite fresh breezes from the S.E. at daylight finished boiling. Middle and latter part much the same saw nothing of importance. Employed Coopering oil
Lat 26.40 Long 107.47 E

Saturday March 28th Comes in with fine weather and moderate breezes from the E.S.E. The Bark standing to the E.N.E. by the Wind. Middle and latter part fresh sails from the South. Employed Heaving down oil in the fore hold
Lat 26.20 Long 108.10 E

Sunday March 29th Comes in with moderate breezes from the S.E. the Bark heading on different tacks. Middle and latter part much the same saw nothing of importance. Ends with strong trades
Lat 26.15 Long 109.12 E

Monday March 30th First part of this day fresh breezes from the Southward the Bark heading to the S.W. under short sail. Middle and latter part quite rough saw small fish and birds.
Lat 26.30 Long 108.36 E

Tuesday March 31st This day comes in with fresh breezes from the Southward the Bark heading to S.W. Middle and latter part much the same saw nothing of importance
Lat 27.10 Long 107.36 E
